WORLD YOUTH PARLIAMENT FOR WATER (WYPW)



The World Youth Parliament for Water mission is:

- To coordinate youth actions and advocacy for water, at a local, watershed and international level.
- To ensure youth recognition as a key stakeholder in the water sector.
- To raise youth awareness about water issues.
- To strengthen youth capacities to act for water.

In preparation for its next General Assembly which will be held in April 2015 in South Korea during the 7th World Water Forum, meetings are being organised by continent to identify and prepare the young people to be active representatives of their region.



The African meeting was organised in collaboration with the institute 2iE, in the context of the African regional preparation process for the 7th World Water Forum. Before and during the **Africa Water 2014** forum, alongside the 500 other participants, the young people had the opportunity to present their messages and proposals through their declaration and action plan.

This youth delegation was made up of representatives from previous WYPW, students from 2iE and other young people from around the continent, selected following a call for applications.

The three were present at this preparatory meeting to pass on the torch!



THE AFRICAN MEETING AT A GLANCE



- 44 young participants from 14 countries brought together.
- **3** days of meetings between young people and experts and **3** jdays participating in the Africa Water 2014 Forum.
- 4 themes covered.

Knowledge and cross-cutting skills acquired.

- 14 local commitments to be implemented by the young people with the support of ISW.
- 1 declaration presented and officially adopted during Africa Water 2014.
- 3 recommendations made
- 10 new representatives identified to take the message to the WYPW General Assembly to be held at the 7th World Water Forum in 2015.

We observe:


- Insufficient knowledge about good practices of hygiene, sanitation and the efficient use of water in communities prone to water-related diseases and limited access to potable water.

- Non-existence or inefficacy of certain water management committees which decreases the life span of the infrastructure for potable water points.
- Overexploitation of the natural resources through deforestation, agriculture and over-fishing which causes environmental degradation.
- Pollution of the soil and water by the use of pesticides and chemical fertilizers destroying the biodiversity.
- Abusive utilization of wood as source of heat in households contributing to climate change, especially in rural areas.
- Populations do not master the 3R principles (Reduce, Repair and Retrofit).
