# **BUTTERFLY EFFECT PRESENTATION**

- +150 national-wide and international organizations
- 5 continents
- Since **2012**
- Coordinated by the International **Secretariat for Water** (ISW)
- Promotes effective local solutions to improve access to water and sanitation services
- Water resources management.

- Spreads the voices of organizations to the international scene Stands out for its integrated vision of the water sector, covering the entire water
- cycle
- Facilitates dialogue and scales up common messages Defends the human rights to water and sanitation for the **underprivileged** (youth, women, indigenous...)



# **SIMAVI PRESENTATION**

Simavi focus on women and girls enjoying their rights to water and sanitation

We work with partner organizations in 10 countries to build lasting change on three areas:

- Water and toilets for all
- Stronger equality for women
- Local climate solutions



Systems change is our approach

A brief history

- A Forum for debate and exchange on water related issues.
- Held every 3 years
- Main international event on the subject, bringing together a wide range of stakeholders (politicians, institutions, donors, the private sector, humanitarian and intergovernmental organizations, researchers, academics, etc.).
- Each WWForum is organized by the **World Water Council** and the host country.

Civil Society Organizations (CSO) for water, including youth organizations, were presented in a more structured way during the World Water Forums for the first time in **2012,** having representatives from all over the world. Since then, they have multiplied and diversified, which is why umbrella networks seem increasingly important, such as the Butterfly Effect Coalition



## **10TH WORLD WATER FORUM** Presentation



- Will take place from May 18-24 2024, in Bali, Indonesia.
- The third to be held in Asia, after the one in South Korea in 2015 and the one in Japan in 2003.

Asia, the most densely populated and dynamically progressing region, continues to predominantly rely on agriculture while facing significant water-dependency and a limited focus on environmental conservation, largely attributed to its pursuit of economic growth.







# **10TH WORLD WATER FORUM** Presentation



- 2nd stakeholder meeting took place on Oct 12 & 13th in Bali.
- Over **1 000** participants
- The goverrnment of Indonesia seemed determined to make the Forum a "success", with a focus on Water Justice and promotion of indigenous traditions
- Participation of CSO representatives very low (due mainly to lack of financial support to open up the meeting)
- BE's messages disseminated and integrated in some sessions.







## Presentation

• Theme: Water for Shared Prosperity

As with every edition, the Forum is divided into 3 distinct processes:

- The Thematic process
- The Political process
- The Regional process
- Youth plan

This edition is organized by the World Water Council and the government of the Republic of Indonesia, mainly the Ministry of Public Works and Housing and the Minstry of Maritime and Investment Affairs.





# **10TH WORLD WATER FORUM** Thematic process

• **Objective**: Sharing best practices and experiences, develop cooperative methods and partnerships on particular thematic solutions

The thematic process is composed of 6 themes, with 5 sub-themes each.

- Water Security and Prosperity
- Water for Humans and Nature
- Disaster Risk Reduction and Management
- Governance, Cooperation and Hydro-diplomacy
- Sustainable Water Finance
- Knowledge and Innovation





Regional process

- **Objective**: developing, analyzing, and presenting Case-Studies and practices related to issues at the local and regional levels.
- Specifying regional priorities, facilitate regional dialogues and raise the political profile of water in the respective region.

# **10TH WORLD WATER FORUM** Political process

- **Objective**: Addressing political issues to high-level representatives, through different levels:
  - Bassin authorities process
  - Head of States process
  - Ministerial process
  - Parliamentarian process
  - Local authorities process





How to participate?

- Everyone can participate to the Forum and register online, either for 1,3 or 6 days
- Different registration fees if your organization comes from an OECD country or not, and whether you are a **youth**, student or retired individual
- Difficult registration fees for civil society organizations, and the fees are very high (between 550 and 900 EUR/pers).





## How to contribute?

## CALL FOR CONTRIBUTIONS IS OPEN

Objective: Giving the opportunity to all stakeholders (with special attention to those that have not been involved yet) to contribute to the thematic and regional processes.

A submission does not entail automatic acceptance. **1 form/session** and no more than **5 submissions** /organization. Propose concrete initatives (do not be vague)

In the form, indicate "perhaps" for the question on participation in the Bali Forum, and in the box, ask for financial support through a sponsorship mechanism





# **10TH WORLD WATER FORUM** How to contribute?

## **CALL FOR CONTRIBUTIONS IS OPEN**

- Deadline: December 18th
- What kind of contribution? Case studies, speakers, written contributions
- Target: have 1 contribution and 1 speaker from CSOs/ONGs per each sub-theme
- Deliverable: We will provide a mapping tool to repertoriate how has contributed to which sub-theme





Advocacy for better inclusion of civil society

Last July, the Butterfly Effect sent a letter to the organizers asking for registration fees reduction and a sponsorship mechanism.

Organizers said that they need to see better involvement of civil society in the preparatory process...

Therefore, we need to mobilize ourselves and contribute to show them we are invovled!



## 9th World Water Forum - Dakar

- A participatory advocacy process led for almost a year
- Conducted from local to global level
- Mobilized +200 participants from all 5 continents
- 1 global consultation and 6 online workshops
- A policy position paper with 5 political demands addressed to the international community and national governments.

## UN 2023 Water Conference

- Reshaped policy paper towards
   international water governance
- Organized an official side-event within the UN headquarter
- Presentation of the Water Justice
   Manifesto during a CSO's event
- Open letter to UN representatives to ask
  for strong commitments
  - +130 signatories from 47 countries





Messages that can be relayed - to States

- Developing water-related risk management, adaptation and disaster plans in crisis situations
- Applying IWRM at the basin and local level
- Fostering cooperation between ministires
- Recognizing the role of local authorities and communities
- Establishing tools to ensure inclusive, informed and effective participation of civil society • Ensuring equitable representation of women, youth and indigenous people in water
- management
- Ratifying international conventions on transboundary water cooperation



Messages that can be relayed - the international community

- Declaring the global water crisis
- Recognizing water as a common good
- Recognizing the right of participation of non-state actors
- Improving aid targetiing to local level, to the most vulnerable areas

The Butterfly Effect also advocates for improved follow-up from one Forum to another, and more synergies between WWForums (and other water related international events) and UN processes.

We also advocate for stonger synergies between sectors (biodiversity, health, agriculture..)
