WYPW 6th General Assembly

Water and Youth: Levers for
Cooperation and Peace

The General Assembly of the World Youth Parliament for Water is an opportunity to influence the global water agenda, collaborate on tangible water solutions with fellow members and allies, engage with experts, explore diverse cultures, and forge new friendships.

For its 6th edition, the International Secretariat for Water (ISW) and the World Youth Parliament for Water (WYPW) will convene the General Assembly in Bali, Indonesia, in the frame of the 10th World Water Forum, scheduled from May 15th to May 25th, 2024. For the course of these 10 days (4 days preceding the World Water Forum and 6 days overlapping with it), 70 dedicated youth have been chosen for in-person participation. They were selected based on their background, knowledge, leadership skills, and commitment to their community.

The young water parliamentarians will engage in training sessions led by influential professionals, exchange ideas with peers from across the globe, and most importantly, advocate for youth voices in water-related decision-making processes, aiming to drive swift and meaningful change. The youth are eager to take action and are thirsty for change.

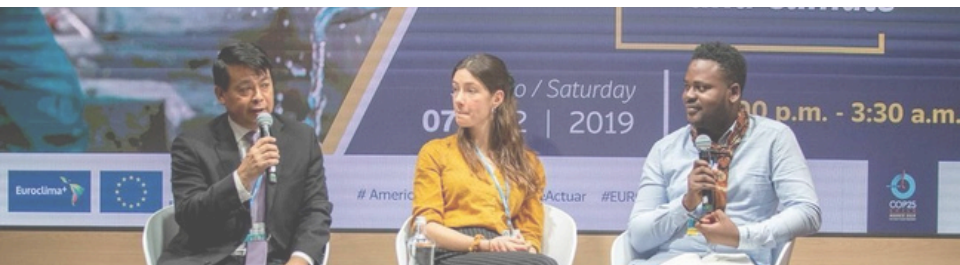




About the theme and objectives

The theme for this 6th General Assembly is "Water and Youth: Levers for Cooperation and Peace", and it will address various dimensions of the 10th World Water Forum dedicated to 'Water for Shared Prosperity'. The goal of the International Water Secretariat is to support and contribute to the capacity building of young people so that they can fully harness their potential to be genuine actors in water governance. Young parliamentarians will leverage the knowledge gained during the preparatory process, which included various regional dialogues and preparatory workshops. They will refine their knowledge and messages within the framework of this General Assembly's program, during which they will have the opportunity to:

- Learn from peers and take part in interactive and engaging workshops;
- Discover Indonesian water issues and culture via field visits and activities with local communities;
- Meet with inspiring and high-level experts and other young water leaders;
- Influence the outcomes of the 10th World Water Forum;
- Present youth perspectives and priorities during several sessions and side events of the 10th WWForum;
- Take action in their own communities regarding important water and climate issues
- Continue shaping a strong and unified Global Youth Movement for Water

What is the International Secretariat for Water?

The ISW is a non governmental organization based in Montreal, Canada. The ISW envisions a world in which water is equitably accessible to all, fostering the empowerment of local actors as well as cooperation between borders, generations, and institutions. ISW's mission is to initiate and facilitate actions that contribute to positive systemic changes in the framework of water governance from the local to the global level and to the empowerment of actors involved in the water sector.

One of the three main pillars of the ISW strategy is to empower the #WaterGeneration. ISW's Youth Strategy's vision is inspired by the idea of the youth movement for water; a movement that involves the large-scale, dynamic and connected mobilization of young people worldwide.

The ISW initiated the World Youth Parliament for Water, which held its inaugural General Assembly at the World Water Forum in Marseille. Since then, the World Youth Parliament for Water has evolved into a structured network, with regional, national, and basin-level representations. The ISW facilitates and catalyzes this platform to support youth in advocating for water-related issues and helps amplify their voices. ISW's sister organization, Solidarity Water Europe (Strasbourg, France), initiated the European Youth Parliament for Water in 1998, which has since become a reference for youth in Europe.
